It only seems like yesterday when we last welcomed Gloucester to Ireland Avenue. But, it was in fact six weeks ago that the famous Cherry and White strip was seen at Beeston for a club fixture. Today though we bid greetings to the players, supporters and officials of Gloucester for the Pilkington Cup 4th Round tie.

Ourselves and Gloucester have only met once before in Cup competition, and that was back in February 1990, when Gloucester won by 26 points to 16. Since then there have been many changes at both clubs, with players and officials coming and going. Perhaps most significant has been the arrival at Kingsholme of Barrie Corless as Gloucester's first Director of Rugby. Barrie arrived after success at Northampton in recent years, and has no doubt brought new ideas and initiatives to the West Country side. As this is the last game before the Christmas break, may we wish everybody, from Nottingham and Gloucester alike, a Happy Christmas and good fortune in 1994. Safe journey home, one and all, and we look to continuing support and backing at all levels in the New Year.

FROM TONY BUTCHER - MANAGEMENT CHANGES

I think it important that Club members and supporters are given the background to the changes in the Club Management last week with the decision by David Roberts and myself to step down.
