

### First Team Talk

This afternoon we welcome Gloucester to Sunbury for our second league meeting this season. We overcame them at Kingsholm by a solitary point way back in October and unlike most Irish supporters this season, we have a goal post to thank. Since that date we have secured no more than two league points. Meanwhile, Gloucester are only one place on the table and four points above us having played one more match than us. There is nothing that can be written about today's game that is likely to contribute one whit to our winning of it save to say that having beaten Gloucester away why should we not win at home? The condition of our pitch is more likely to favour our visitors' emphasis on powerful forward play - not that they lack expertise outside the scrum as they have demonstrated frequently in this season's campaign. Easter is just a few weeks away and there is the annual feast of Under 21 rugby talent on display at Sunbury for all enthusiasts on Saturday 2nd and Sunday 3rd April. Ray McLennan tells me that the participants this year include Gloucester, West Hartlepool, Newcastle/Gosforth, Dungannon and the holders Loughborough Students who beat London Irish in the final last year. London clubs include Harlequins, Rosslyn Park, Saracens, Wasps, our own Under 21 side plus a cluster of other clubs from around the country.
