

Talking about pride and passion, no series of fixtures in the rugby calendar ever generated more of those than Gloucestershire v Devonshire. It's a very long, and very honourable series which has produced more memorable deeds than most and inspired many players to play out of their skins.

Devon used to travel up to meet a side almost completely composed of Gloucester and Bristol players, who all knew each other very well indeed, fielding a fifteen trawled from grand old clubs such as Plymouth, Exeter, Torquay, Brixham, even Bideford (for whom heavyweight cricket umpire, David Shepherd, used to play at, would you believe, scrum-half), and it wasn't unknown for some of the side never to have met until they boarded the team coach. But let's not worry about that today. Let's welcome Devonshire, most sincerely, hope for an excellent game, and above all, let's have - here's that word again - fun.

Two more things I must do. First of all, I must thank the Lydney club for making their facilities available, once again, and wish them continued success in what has already become a highly successful season. Best of luck, chaps!

Finally, I must thank retired skipper, Mike Hamlin, for the tremendous job he did for us, and express great pleasure that he is still involved on the coaching side. He's a hard act to follow, but if anyone can do that, it's Andrew Stanley, whose record as captain is quite undeniable. Best of luck Andy! Just do what you did for Gloucester United, and all will be very well indeed.
