

Gloucester rugby programmes





Now it is in a glossy booklet and it doesn't just tell you who are playing it tells you more information and shows you some pictures of people playing. There are lots of adverts and information and interviews with players and officials. The older booklets are thinner than the newer ones and have about two pages; where as the newer ones have about forty pages.

The programmes have always told you who is playing and what time the match starts and that remains the same today. The booklet always tells you the month the date and the year and also the cost including the time the match starts on the front cover. Fixture cards
