#### **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

The Directors herewith beg to submit to the Shareholders of the Company a Balance Sheet for the past year, ending August 31<sup>st</sup>, 1893.

The books of the Company have been audited by Mr. B. J. H. Coombs, and the Balance Sheet duly signed by him.

The Revenue Account shows a net profit of £159 15s 3d on the year. The Director's, therefore, beg to recommend the payment of a Dividend of 5 per cent, which will amount to £150, and to write off the balance £9 15s 3d towards General Depreciation.

The increase of the liabilities as shown in Capital Account under the heading Capital & Counties Bank is the outcome of the Chairman's Statement at the last General Meeting. That instead of issuing more Shares the Directors would for the present make themselves personally responsible to the Bank for the additional Capital required to pay for the Pavilion then in course of construction, but since completed.

The Field for all Athletic purposes has considerably improved and the Directors look forward to continued success with increasing confidence.

The Directors very deeply deplore the loss the Company has sustained in the death of Mr. L. H. Priday. His best services were ever at the disposal of the Board, and to the Directors he was a much valued colleague.

Since the last General Meeting preferment (on which we congratulate him) has taken from Gloucester our esteemed and genial Secretary, Mr. H. S. Simpson, but in Mr. Sidney S. Starr the Company have secured the Services of one well qualified to succeed him.

In accordance with the Articles of Association two of the Directors Messrs A. V. Hatton and T. Gurney, and the Auditor Mr. B. J. H. Coombs retire, and being eligible offer themselves for re-election.
