Fagan at length got the ball from a brother back, and by a strong run managed to get over the line, but the place failed. This caused Gloucestershire to play with some dash, and Coates obtaining possession of the leather tore down the field at a great pace and scored a try, which Boughton converted into a goal.

Soon afterwards Baker broke through the loose and scored, Boughton again placing a goal. Nothing more was scored and at the call of time Gloucestershire were victors by two goals and a try to one try.
