THE NEW ATHLETIC GROUNDS.

The plans of the Gloucester Football and Athletic Grounds having been completed, some idea may now be gathered as to what the grounds will be like when finished. From the plan hung outside Messrs. Roberts' and Starr's shop in Northgate-street, it appears that the front entrance to the grounds will be in Worcester-street, from which side members of the club and persons paying sixpence will view the matches. The Dean's-walk side of the grounds will be reserved for the cheaper places.

Several stands will be erected on either side, whilst a pavilion in the centre of the sixpenny side will appear in due course. On both sides of the ground there will be convenient refreshment stands. The cycling and running track will be a quarter of a mile in circumference. A space has been reserved in the corner of the ground for circuses, shows, etc.

A custodian's house and other small items complete the appointments of the grounds which are suitable for the holding of nearly every kind of sport, and will compare favourable in every respect with any in the West of England.
